Homeowner Grant Opportunity

Ready to improve your home's defenses against wildfire? Get a free wildfire risk assessment and take advantage of first come first serve grant funding in La Plata County that can reimburse part of the cost to improve our ecosystem health and decrease your properties risk.

Funds are available to private landowners within in the mapped program area who complete a free home wildfire risk assessment and hire a contractor to complete wildfire mitigation on their parcel. Once mitigation is completed, the program may reimburse the homeowner up to 50% of the project.
