The two primary determinants of a home's ability to survive a wildfire are a structure's ignitability and quality of the surrounding defensible space. These two factors create a concept called the Home Ignition Zone (HIZ), which includes the structure and the area around it. Learn about the HIZ and how to increase a structures survivability at this free workshop.

WILDFIRE MITIGATION TAX INCENTIVE

If you had actual out-of-pocket expenses for wildfire mitigation in 2023, you may qualify for a taxable income subtraction and a tax credit on your Colorado state taxes. The subtraction can be for 50% of your expenses up to a \$2500 subtraction. In addition, if your federal taxable income is less than \$120,000, you can also claim up to 25% of wildfire mitigation expenses up to \$2500. Landowners will need to submit a Subtractions from Income Schedule (DR 0104AD) and a Colorado Individual Income Tax Return (DR 0104).

If you received any kind of reimbursement from WAP for your mitigation, that amount cannot be counted. There are other details and limitations, so please click the tab below to learn more.
